REMAND ORDER

Charging Party, Krystal Clark (Clark), filed a complaint with the Department of Labor and Industry (Department) alleging unlawful discrimination in employment on the basis of sex and retaliation. Following an informal investigation, the Department determined that a preponderance of the evidence did not support Clark’s allegations that Respondent, WealthVest Marketing, Inc., unlawfully discriminated against Clark. The Department issued a Notice of Dismissal. Clark filed an objection with the Montana Human Rights Commission (Commission). The Commission considered the matter on May 20, 2022. No oral argument was requested for this hearing.

The Commission reviews a decision of the Department to dismiss a complaint using an abuse of discretion standard. Section 49-2-511(2), MCA. After careful consideration, the Commission concludes the determination of the Department to dismiss the complaint in this case is an abuse of discretion. The Commission determined the investigator failed to interview relevant witnesses and failed to provide sufficient analysis in determining that no adverse action occurred. Therefore, the Commission sustains the objection and the case is hereby remanded for hearing to the Office of Administrative Hearings pursuant to § 49-2-505, MCA.

Nothing in this order precludes the parties from engaging in the mediation or other settlement negotiations that would normally occur if the Department’s investigative report had found cause. See § 49-2-504(2)(b), MCA.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that Krystal Clark's objection is **sustained**. The Commission reopens and remands the case to the Office of Administrative Hearings for hearing.
