This matter came before the Human Rights Commission for consideration as scheduled on March 15, 1999. None of the parties or their respective attorneys were present. The Commission, having reviewed the record, and having noted that no objections or exceptions were timely filed by any party, discussed the case. In particular, the Commission discussed issues relating to the Charging Party's damages and the application of bankruptcy law with respect to the corporate Respondent and the joint and several liability of the Respondents.

Following the discussion, the Commission voted 5-0 in favor of adopting the proposed Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order as written by the Hearings Officer, on the grounds that there was substantial, credible evidence to support the proposed findings of law, that the proposed conclusions of law were correct, and that proposed order provided appropriate relief.
